What is Informal Sector

- Informal sector enterprises are enterprises that are not registered by registrar of companies and that produce goods and services meant for the market. In Kenya these enterprises are commonly referred to as “Jua Kali” comprising of informal traders and artisans, majority of whom work by the roadside.

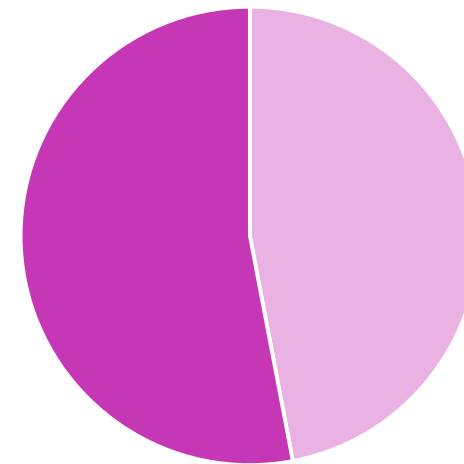
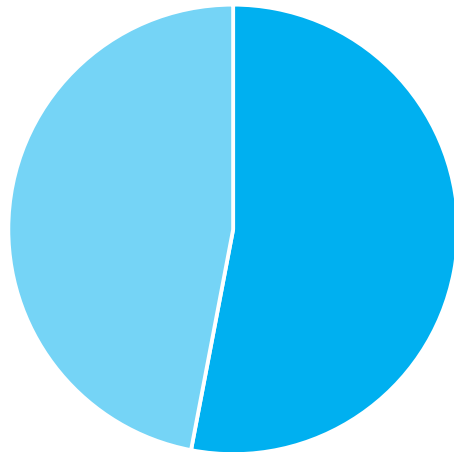


Majority of the men work in trade and repair and manufacturing

Majority of the women are in provision of food services, Saloons



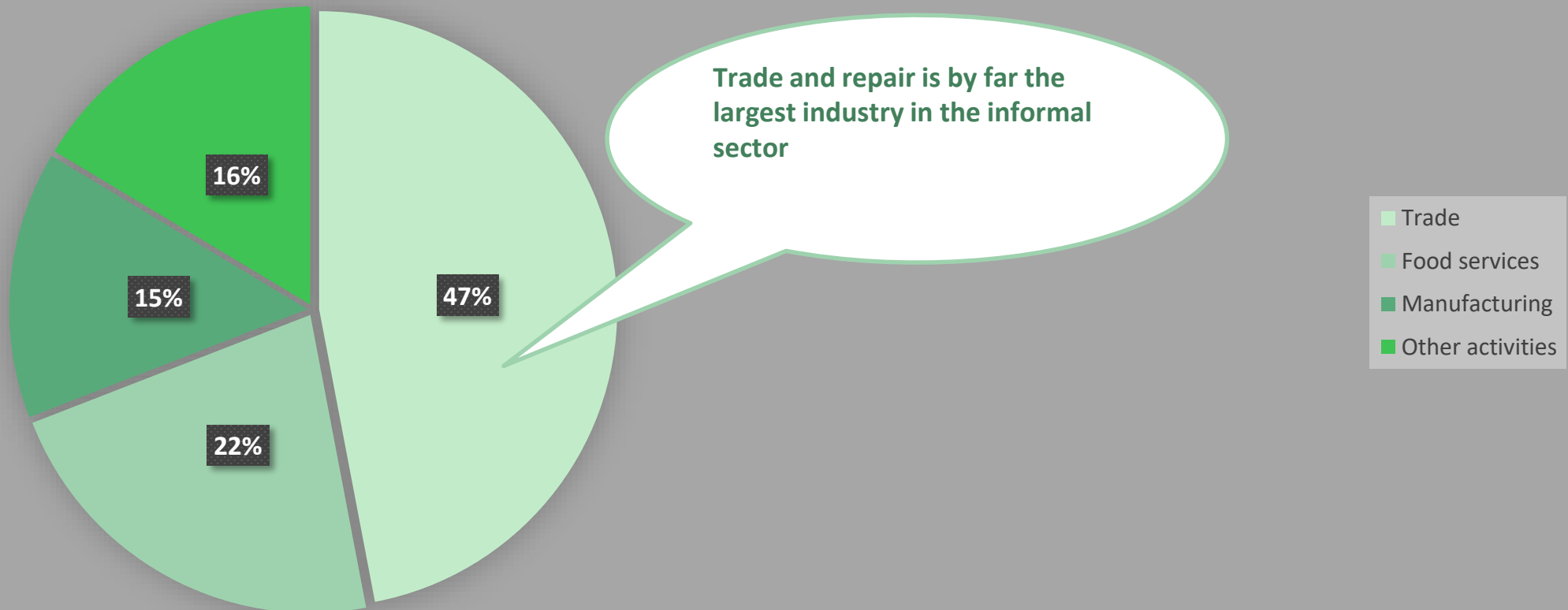

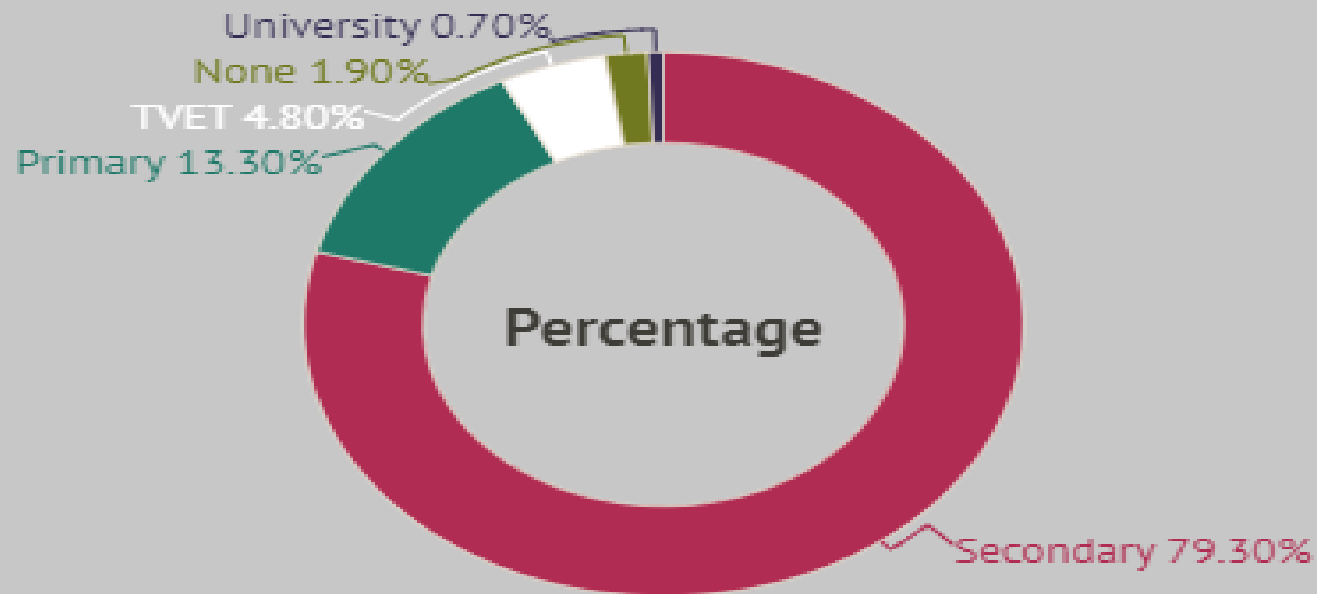
Employment in the informal sector

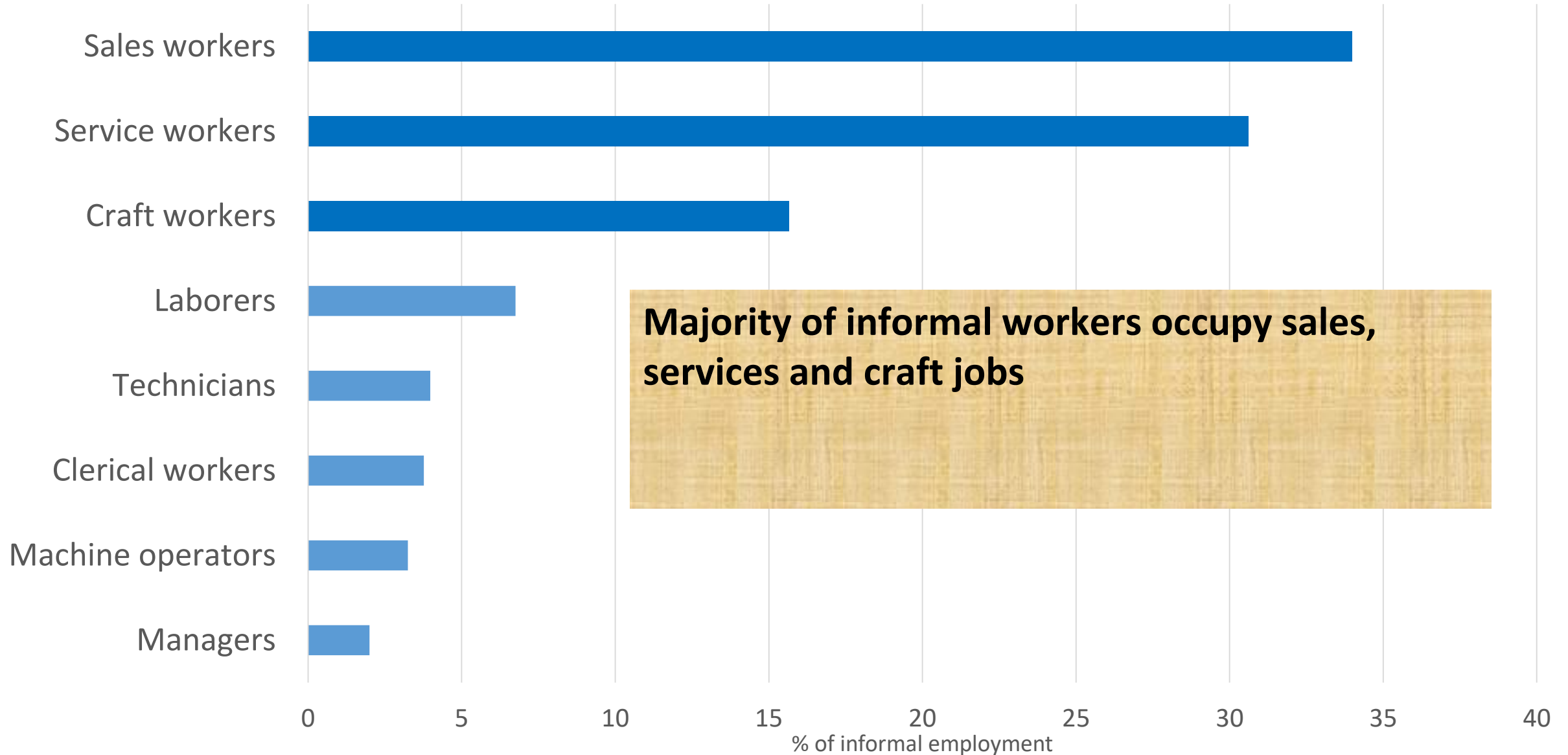
Majority of workers in the informal sector have secondary level education.

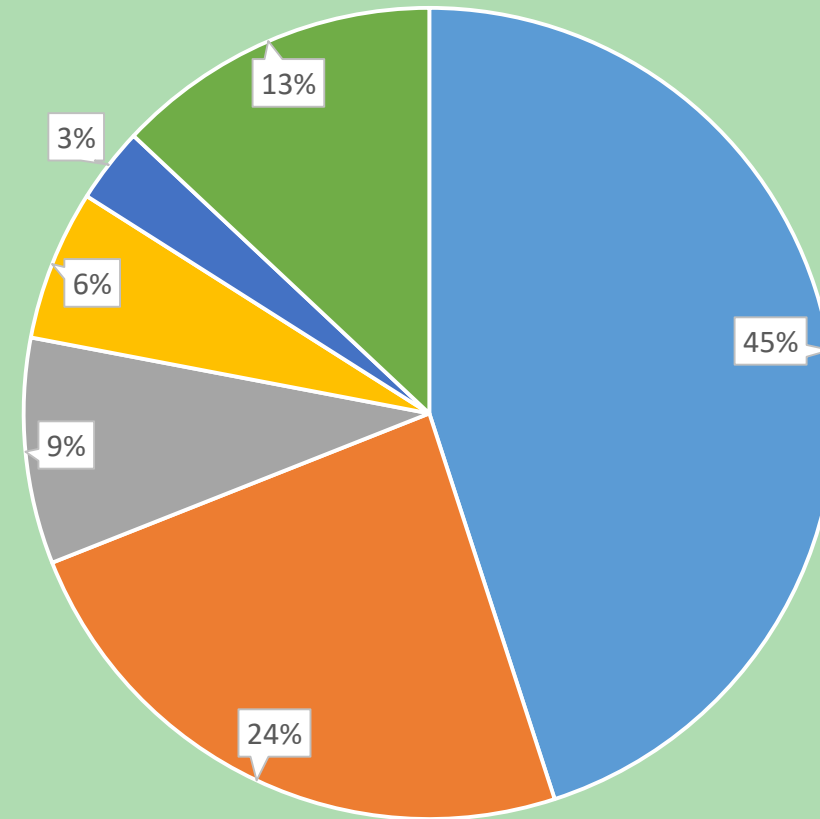


Job Opportunities in the informal sector

Most job opportunities in the Kenyan Informal Sector are associated with **three main types of economic activities**

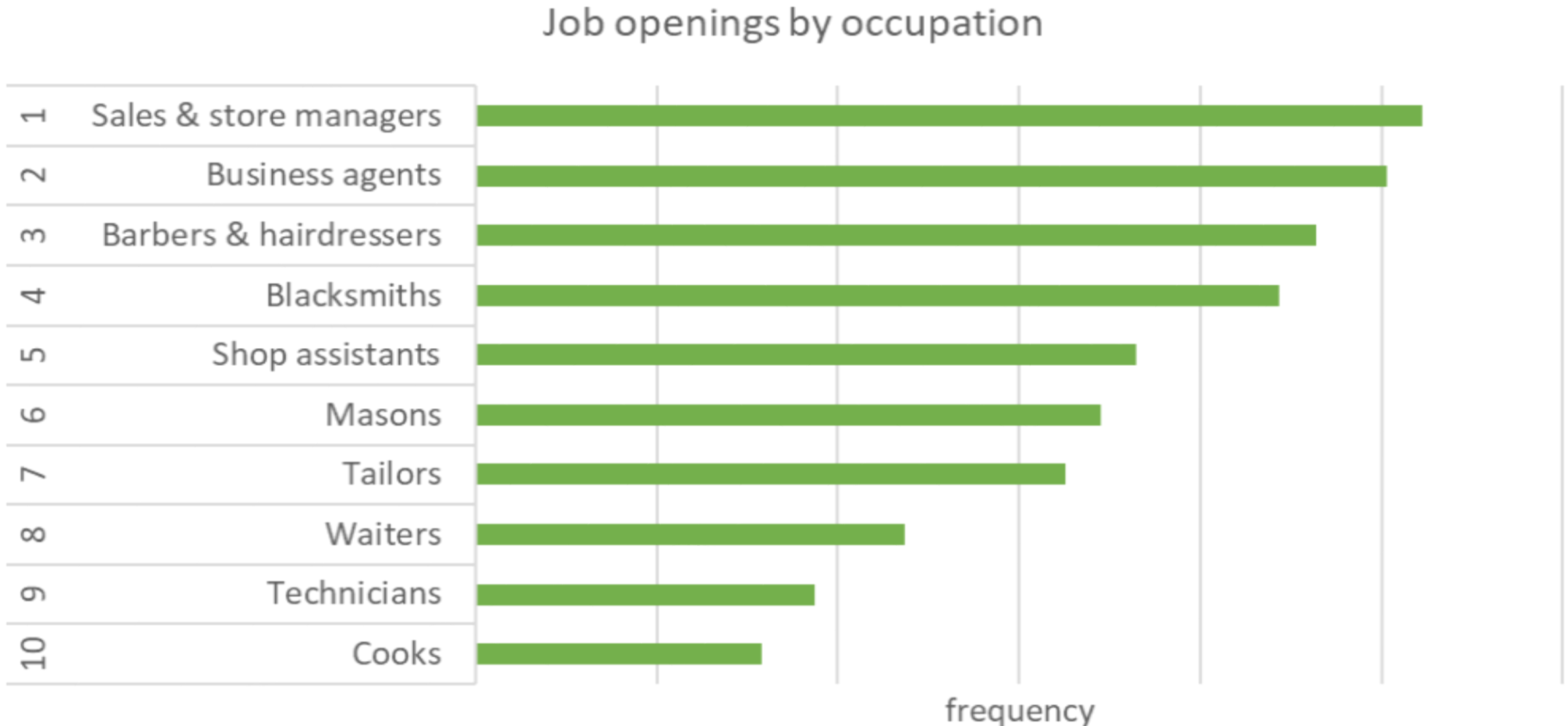
- Trade and repair

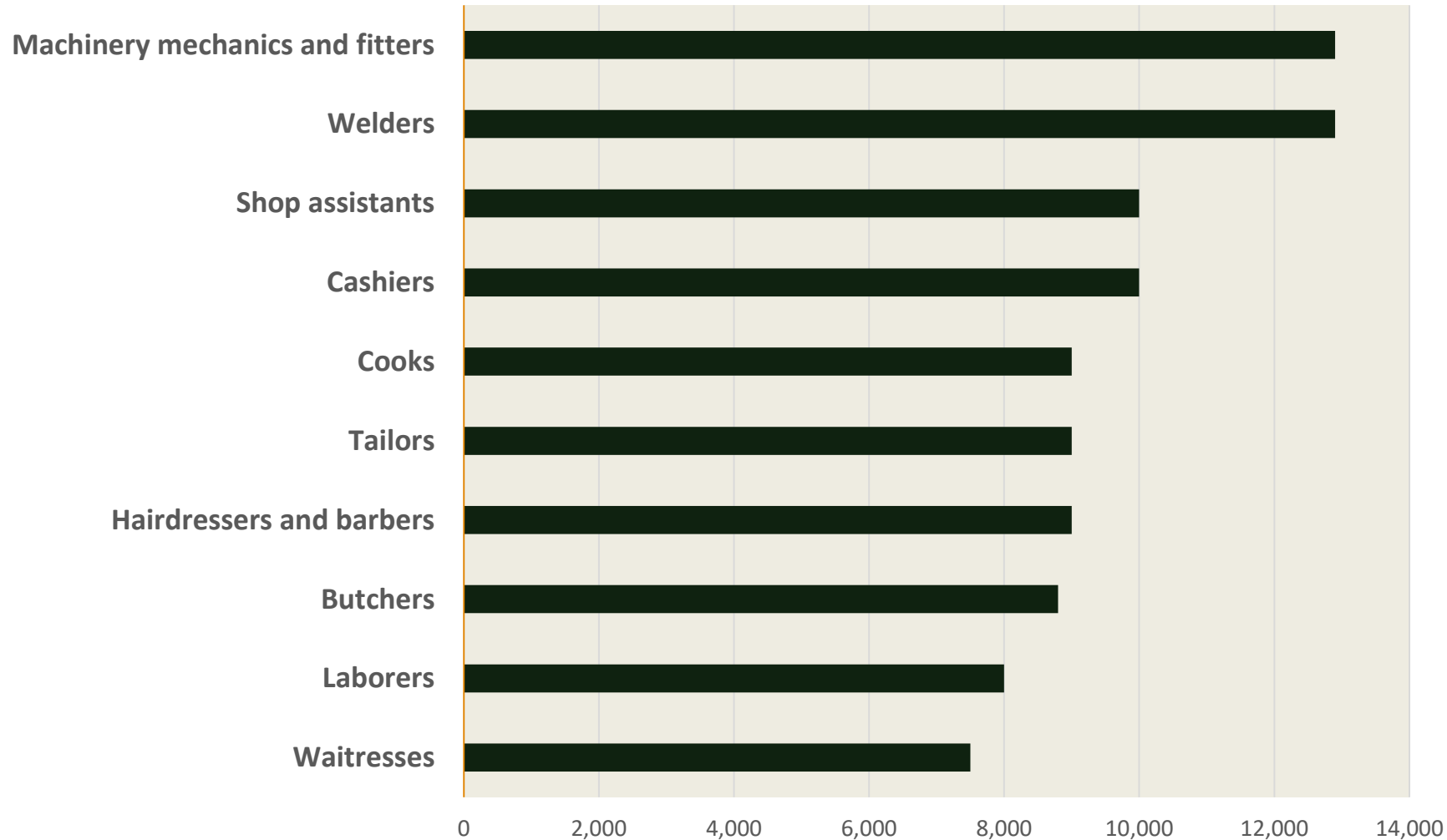
Skills most often preferred by employers
